PCC Music Program

The PCC music program is housed in the Center for the Arts, a state-of-theart facility, at West Campus. The program provides extensive experience and training in all aspects of classical and popular music including classes in theory, history, piano, guitar, studio instruction, music industry and electronic music, consistent with the first two years of a bachelor's degree in music. Students can earn an Associate of Fine Arts degree with a concentration in music that can transfer to a bachelor's degree in music performance, history, theory and education. Facilities include a state-of-the-art MIDI laboratory and electronic piano laboratory, practice rooms, large ensemble rehearsal rooms, the 75 plus-seat Recital Hall and the 425-seat Proscenium Theatre. Major performing ensembles include Wind Ensemble, Orchestra, Jazz Ensemble, Chorale, College Singers and Opera/Musical Theatre. The PCC music program has a reputation for quality instruction and caring instructors.

Eileen Perry Schwartz is originally from New York, where she received her early training from Nadia Reisenberg, Eugenia Hyman and Jascha Zayde. She made her performance debut at age 11 at Town Hall in New York City, and at age 16, performed as soloist with the Chautauqua Festival Orchestra after winning the concerto contest at the prestigious New York summer festival. Leonard Bernstein took a personal interest in her education by sponsoring a scholarship in his name. Well-

known American pianist Ozan Marsh recruited her to the University of Arizona on a full scholarship. There she received her bachelor's and master's degrees in piano performance. Schwartz has performed throughout the country in solo recitals and as featured soloist with orchestras. Since joining the faculty at Pima in 1980, she has performed as soloist with the Marshall Symphony Orchestra (Marshall, Texas), the Tucson Pops and in recital throughout the country as a soloist, accompanist and part of a two-piano team. She has also performed extensively in Sierra Vista and Green Valley for the Pianists Foundation of America, an organization that named her "Pianist of the Year" in 1989. In 1996, she was voted "Outstanding Faculty of the Year" by her students, an honor she holds dear to her heart. In 2008 she was awarded an Excellence in Teaching award from the "24 Karat Experience" organization and was invited to join their board of governors. Schwartz teaches piano, aural perception, class piano and exploring music through piano at Pima.
