

Jim Matsushino is a native Arizonan and graduate of the University of Arizona with a B.A. in music education. Following graduation, he taught band and orchestra at Coronado K-8 in the Amphitheatre School District in Tucson, Arizona. Matsushino moved to College Station, Texas where he was the middle school band director and assistant high school director for the Hearne Independent School District, a small 2A rural school. After two years teaching in Hearne, he moved on to become the head junior high band director and lead assistant at Madisonville Consolidated School District, a rural 3A school district. He taught in Madisonville for three years helping build one of the better junior high school band programs in the

College Station area. Matsushino came back to Arizona to take over the Čienega High School Instrumental Music program in Vail, Arizona. He has seen steady growth and interest in the small community of Vail for the instrumental music program over the past six years. Vail's instrumental music program changed from one that was close to being eliminated to one which is ever improving and growing with its quality and sophistication.

PCC Music Program

The PCC music program is housed in the Center for the Arts, a state-of-the-art facility, at West Campus. The program provides extensive experience and training in all aspects of classical and popular music including classes in theory, history, piano, guitar, studio instruction, music industry and electronic music, consistent with the first two years of a bachelor's degree in music. Students can earn an Associate of Fine Arts degree with a concentration in music that can transfer to a bachelor's degree in music performance, history, theory and education. Facilities include a state-of-the-art MIDI laboratory and electronic piano laboratory, practice rooms, large ensemble rehearsal rooms, the 75 plus-seat Recital Hall and the 425-seat Proscenium Theatre. Major performing ensembles include Wind Ensemble, Orchestra, Jazz Ensemble, Chorale and College Singers. The PCC music program has a reputation for quality instruction and caring instructors.

Dr. Mark Nelson is completing his thirty-fourth year of teaching and performing professionally. A noted tubist, he has premiered over 30 new works for tuba and released two internationally recognized tuba CD recordings, New England Reveries and Aboriginal Voices. His solo performances have included recitals at many of the International Tuba Euphonium Conferences, recitals across the United States as well as performances and lectures in Austria, Australia, Canada, England, and Japan. Keenly interested in music education, he served four terms as vice-president for professional development and is presently the vice-president for collegiate/research for the Arizona Music Educators Association. He is also the recipient of

the George C Wilson Leadership Award and the Excellence in Music Administration Award from AMEA. He frequently serves as a band adjudicator and has also conducted regional honor bands in several states. His degrees include the B.A. from Point Loma Nazarene University, the M.M. and D.M.A. from Arizona State University and the M.Ed. in education administration from the University of Vermont. Previous appointments include professor of music at Millikin University and associate professor of music at the University of Vermont as well as several years of public school instrumental music teaching. He has been the chair of performing arts and director of bands at Pima Community College in Tucson, Arizona since 2000 where in addition to directing the Wind Ensemble, he also teaches courses in electronic music and music fundamentals and is the euphonium and tuba instructor.
